| Palm Springs | Brendan O'Neill stated that one concern came up after seeing the Palm Springs presentation in Toronto and agenda. This concern centers around the Air Museum and riding in the planes. It was felt that we needed to have a liability discussion from a governess perspective. Brendan asked for the board's thoughts on this subject. • Should we have an additional waiver? • Is it financially fair when only a small number of attendees can participate? • Do we need to add additional insurance? Discussion followed. It was decided that Christy Carper would share the cost of the different planes, as well as the Air Museum's waiver. Charles Berge offered to have his lawyer the waiver over. After reviewing the conference budget, as well as the waiver, the board will make a decision at the February Board meeting. Brendan O'Neill also shared the cost of the nightly room rate in Palm Springs, which is \$269.00 a night, plus a \$35.00 a day resort fee, plus tax. A subsidy discussion followed and the importance of clearly communicating the cost to the attendees. 
